

Over the past twenty-five years Peter Shakeshaft, and his wife, Maureen, have interviewed many past and present Freckleton residents, and recorded their recollections of village life from the early nineteenth to the mid-twentieth century. The interviews, combined with local newspaper reports and private correspondence, have enabled a hitherto unseen picture of Freckleton to emerge from otherwise rapidly fading shadows.

All communities are "unique", and, in a fast-changing world, this book provides a link to the people of Freckleton who, in their lifetimes, were, and are, responsible for ensuring the continuity of their own community. All those who really know Freckleton will surely echo the sentiment "you can take a person out of Freckleton, but you can't take Freckleton out of a person".
